Dear Parents and carers,

Welcome to 2017. Well, the end of January 2017, so 1/12 of the year is done and dusted! Whilst most people end the Christmas festivities and start January wanting simply to hit the ground, at St Peter's we hit the ground running, and I do not mean with a local gym subscription that becomes a good intention rather than a regular habit by the middle of the month. Our Year 6 pupils returned to an improved classroom environment, with carpeting throughout and a dividing wall with double doors between the two classrooms. This investment has significantly improved the learning environment for the children, dramatically reducing the noise that is carried between the two classes and making for a calmer learning atmosphere undisturbed by the sound of scraping chairs and dropped equipment. Our Year 6 pupils worked hard in the autumn term to show their mature and committed approaches to learning, and we hope that their improved classroom surroundings will only add to their willingness to work hard, study well and achieve greatness.

January also saw a change in the parish priest at the Church of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and St Peter the Apostle in Waterlooville with the arrival of Monsignor Canon Jeremy Garratt. Fr Jeremy has already celebrated Mass in school with Years 3 and 4, as well as taking the opportunity to visit some of the classrooms to meet the children. We are blessed indeed to be linked with two vibrant and committed parishes in Waterlooville and Horndean, and it is a joy to see our children participate with such enthusiasm in the liturgical celebrations that form a part of their spiritual growth in school and within families. In conversation with Fr Jeremy after the Year 3 and 4 Mass, I bemoaned the phrase often issued at youth masses and in schools that 'You children are the Church of tomorrow'. I disagree. Our children and young adults are very much the Church of today, the here, the now and the present. The difference is that they have the gift and the privilege of taking today's Church into tomorrow, so it is our responsibility as teachers, parents and carers to instil in them the faith that will enable them to do this successfully and with true fulfilment. I look forward therefore to 2017 being a year when ever closer links can be forged between our school and the local Christian parishes.

### **Attendance & Punctuality:**

Attendance was slightly down at 97.1% at the end of the Autumn Term but I am pleased to say that it has risen again to 97.3%. Let's hope as we start to shake off the winter bugs, that we reach our target of 97.4% and overtake it.

When a child is unwell, please inform the school on the first morning of absence by 9.30 a.m., providing a reason for the absence and an approximate return to school date. For absence of longer than 3 days, the school also requires a letter on your child's return, stating the reason for absence and any medical advice that the school needs to be aware of.

### **Morning Drop off at St Peter's:**

We encourage all parents to park offsite and walk your children into school in the mornings using the path through the playing fields.

If your youngest child is in Year 3, 4 5 or 6 and you need to drive on-site, please use the North Playground drop off point. Please pull up to the give way markings by the gate. This allows two cars to off-load at the same time. It would be helpful if you could say goodbye to your child and ensure they have coat/lunchbox/bookbag ready to hand **before** you get to the drop off point so they can jump out quickly and not cause delay for other parents waiting behind you in the queue. Parents who drive and need to take a child to the South Playground (Years R, 1 or 2) please use the central car park but do not under any circumstances leave your car where it causes a blockage. If there is no room you may need to go around the circuit one more time. The best way for a calm start to the school day is to park offsite and walk in. Thank you for your on-going understanding and vigilance at this busy time of the day.

### **On-Line Safety:**

Since Christmas we might well have some new devices in our homes. Are you finding it hard to keep up with the latest games and gadgets? It is wonderful that our children are so competent and user friendly with technology but it is also a concern that they might not be safe. Please remember to check that games/DVDs etc. are suitable for your child. This is particularly relevant when there are older children/adults in the house playing games rated '12', '15' and '18' for example. The following link may be helpful;

### **Food Allergies and Packed Lunches/Snacks:**

We have a number of children in school who are allergic to peanuts so would ask that absolutely **no nut products** are sent to school for snacks or lunches in order to protect these children from a reaction. We are having a few children bringing in NUTELLA spread. Please be aware that some chocolate spreads also contain traces of nuts. **Packed lunches should not contain sweets/confectionary/chocolate bars.** KS2 children may bring in a piece of fruit for their mid-morning snack.

### **Cakes in school:**

We would like to ask parents to please **not** send in cakes for distribution to the children in school time (*or after school*), whether they require cutting up or not, unless they have organized a party lunch in school. Our lunchtime staff are always happy to cut up and serve a cake for a special birthday lunch which has been booked through the office. We are in the process of reviewing our policy for the distribution of food prepared outside of school, and will issue an update in the near future, the key issue being that of food allergies referenced above.
