Dear Parents and Carers,

A new school year that started as busy as always was made all the busier at the end of the month by our Ofsted inspection on 27th and 28th September. Every child in the school was a credit to their families, their teachers and the St Peter's community. The pupils' behaviour, good manners and engagement with the members of the inspection team were all exemplary over the two days, so well done and thank you to all the children. The final report from the inspection will take several weeks to produce, so we will be able to publish the outcome towards the end of October.

The start of term has been a great success as the pupils have settled into their new classes, and returned to their good routines, so quickly and effectively. As far as school life goes, we have had a quiet and settled September with very few off-site visits. This has been deliberately planned to start the year with focus and attention centred squarely on regular classroom learning routines. Now that we are all back in the swing of things, however, October heralds the start of adventures, with Year 5 and Year 6 residential visits taking place before the half term holiday.

**Attendance and Punctuality:**

**Whole School Target for 2017-18 = 97.5%**

Welcome back everybody and welcome to our new parents and children who have joined us. We managed to hit our whole school target last year of 97.4% but only by the skin of our teeth. Thank you to all those parents/carers who strive to get their children to school on time each day.

As we have high expectations at St Peter's our whole school attendance target for this year has risen to 97.5%. I think we can do it!

**Aim for 100% attendance and 100% punctuality**

385 pupils' learning is off to an excellent start; achieving 100% attendance in their new classes. Of course we know that due to illness, on-going medical conditions and unexpected circumstances it is not always possible to achieve 100% but if we aim for excellence, we will reach as close to it as possible and give our children the best chance they have for success. Last year, Year 5 achieved the best attendance and punctuality across the whole school. Will they do it again in Year 6, or will another year group knock them off the hot spot?

### **Parking:**

If your child is entering school via the North Playground (Key Stage 2), you should use the drop off point via the left hand lane. If you are taking your Key Stage 1 child to the South Playground and need to use the central visitors' car park, please make sure that you do not block the entrance and exit, even "just for a minute". Cars should be able to move through at all times.

Please park on local roads considerately and responsibly. On two occasions this week a mother with a double buggy found the footpath blocked by a parent who had parked on the verge and not left sufficient space. In this case her only option was to wheel her children onto the road, at considerable danger. Next time she will contact the Police/Local Council. Thank you for your co-operation.

### **CLIMBING ON SCHOOL GROUNDS:**

Would all parents please ensure that children do **not** climb on trees, railings or walls on school grounds at any time. Apart from the health and safety risk to children should they fall and hurt themselves, there is the risk of damage to school property. Thank you for your support and co-operation.

### **SPORTS:**

A start to a new school year and we have some exciting sports events coming up. In October pupils from various classes will be participating in Football Skills, Tri Golf Festival and a Fun Run. These events are a great experience for the children as they get to have fun working as a team and also meeting children from other schools around the Havant and Waterlooville area.

### **INNER SECURITY DOOR – RECEPTION OFFICE**

Could we please ask all our parents to remind their children that they should **not** reach up and release the switch for the inner security door and let themselves out in the main reception area. The security door is there to ensure the safety of **all** the children in school. School staff cannot be responsible for your child's safety if they are unaware that a child has let themselves out through the security door. Please reinforce this message with your child, reminding them that they should only leave the safety of the school building if they have spoken to a member of the school staff and that person knows they are leaving the building. If you need to look at lost property, please go via the reception office. Do not cut through from the north playground.

### **Naming Uniform:**

Please check this weekend that all items of clothing, especially jumpers and coats, are clearly named. While the weather is warm children often discard their jumpers during the day and we can only return them if they are clearly named.

### **Wearing of ear-rings in school - PE/Games**

If your child/children usually wear ear-rings in school, could you please ensure that they have in their book bag a roll of micropore tape (available to buy at chemists or supermarkets), in order that they can tape over their ear-rings before a PE/Games lesson for safety reasons. Alternatively, they can either take them out themselves before the lesson, if they are confident to do so, or leave their ear-rings at home when it is a PE/Games day. Please make sure that the ear-rings your child wears to school are of the small stud type. Large stud or hoop ear-rings can pose a danger to the children themselves and others during PE/Games and are not permitted in school. Thank you for your consideration.

### **Book Bags:**

Could we please remind parents that bags brought into school by the children need to be small enough to fit in their trays in the classrooms. Please **do not** send children into school with rucksacks/backpacks as these take up too much room in the cloakroom areas.
