Dear Parents and Carers,

Blink and you miss it! Before we have even really settled into the beauty of autumn, we are pressed into preparation for Christmas. I had to call into Sainsbury's early on the morning of Wednesday, 1st November (the staff room biscuit reserves being seriously depleted!), and already the Hallowe'en stock had been replaced by three aisles bursting with festive chocolate and stocking filler presents. Here at St Peter's, though, we are taking things a little more slowly.

The children have really got stuck into their work during November, bedding into the higher expectations of their current year groups and starting to make strong and steady progress across the curriculum. The school has a drive to secure pupils' core skills in reading and writing as a key priority for the year, these being the bedrock of progress and success across all subjects. To that end, we are launching an appeal for volunteers to offer 90 minutes a week of their time to come and read or play maths games with pupils to support their learning. Details on how to offer your time appear later in this newsletter; why not make it your New Year's resolution for 2018? Meanwhile, though not quite as quick off the mark as the supermarkets, we are busy getting ready for the upcoming festivities. In RE, the learning topic will turn to Advent, helping the children to appreciate the true benefit of this period of preparation in the liturgical calendar, rather than just focusing on the Christmas season. Equally, children are preparing for our Key Stage 1 Nativity plays and Key Stage 2 carol service, and I look forward to welcoming many of you to join us in these events.

Spaces in current Year 3:

At St Peter's, when children move from KS1 to KS2, the Governors decided some years ago to increase the number of pupils on roll from 60 to 64 in the year group. This year we are in the exceptional position of being able to offer vacancies in our current Year 3 classes. ATTENDANCE UPDATE:

Target for whole school attendance is 97.5%

Attendance data continues to be closely monitored and analysed on a daily basis.

- ✓ Whole school attendance is currently 97.4%, just under this year's target.
- ✓ 75% of pupils have an attendance of 98% or above (321 pupils).
- ✓ 56% of pupils have 100% attendance since the start of the school year (241 pupils).

Punctuality:

Congratulations again to Year 6! They have been the most punctual year group in school with the least number of late sessions since the beginning of the school year. We take attendance and punctuality extremely seriously in St Peter's and so do the majority of our families. Please ensure that your child gets to school by 8.50am. The playgrounds are open from 8.30am to help you with this. Any child that arrives after this time will have to come through the main office, receive a late mark in the register and could miss essential learning. Three or more late marks in a six week period will result in letters being sent home and discussions will take place with either the Headteacher, or Pastoral Lead/Attendance Officer. APPLICATIONS FOR ADMISSION TO RECEPTION SEPTEMBER 2018:

Could I remind all parents who may have a child starting school in September 2018 to complete an online application form to Hampshire County Council (for Hampshire residents) and to Portsmouth City Council (for residents living outside the borough). If you are unable to complete the form online, the school office holds paper copies of the HCC form. The closing date for Reception applications is **mid-night on Monday, 15 January 2018**. At the same time, please complete a St Peter's Supplementary Information Form, available from the school office or via the school website. This needs to be supported by a baptismal certificate **or** signed by your Parish Priest if you wish your application to be considered on faith grounds. Please ensure your application forms are handed in to the school office before the deadline. Applications submitted after the above date will **not** be included in the main admission round and could jeopardise your child's chances of gaining a place in September. Thank you.

Book Bags:

Could we please remind parents that bags brought into school by the children need to be small enough to fit in their trays in the classrooms. Please **do not** send children into school with rucksacks/backpacks as these take up too much room in the cloakroom areas.

CHANGES to Breakfast Club Payments:

We **no longer accept cash on the door** as you can now pay for Breakfast Club on Scopay. If you do not have a Scopay account then please contact us in the office and we will issue you with an access code, alternatively you can send the cash into the school office. Hopefully this will be helpful to you as you will no longer have to find cash to pay on the day. Breakfast Club will still operate on a drop in basis, i.e. you do not have to book in advance, and the only change is that you no longer need to send cash in with your child.

Our Scopay system is updated with the previous week's breakfast club register every Monday morning. If you have any queries please contact us in the school office.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB:

We also offer an After School Club for our children, which runs every day, every week of the school term. The children are looked after by our staff and have the opportunity to play games outside, use the school laptops, along with plenty of other activities including board games, Lego, colouring, as well as many other fun activities. You can choose to either put your children into After School Club from 3.15 – 3.45 p.m. for £2.00 per session, or the full session which is from 3.15 – 4.15 p.m. for £4.00 per session. The After School Club is bookable on a termly basis, although if the club isn't full we will try to accommodate one-off bookings. If you would like any further details on the After School Care that we offer, please do contact the School Office.

Wearing of ear-rings in school - PE/Games:

If your child/children usually wear ear-rings in school, could you please ensure that they have in their book bag a roll of micropore tape (available to buy at chemists or supermarkets), in order that they can tape over their ear-rings before a PE/Games lesson for safety reasons. Alternatively, they can either take them out themselves before the lesson, if they are confident to do so, or leave their ear-rings at home when it is a PE/Games day. Please make sure that the ear-rings your child wears to school are of the small stud type. Large stud or hoop ear-rings can pose a danger to the children themselves and others during PE/Games and are not permitted in school. Thank you for your consideration.

INNER SECURITY DOOR – RECEPTION OFFICE

Could we please ask all our parents to remind their children that they should **not** reach up and release the switch for the inner security door and let themselves out in the main reception area. The security door is there to ensure the safety of **all** the children in school. School staff cannot be responsible for your child's safety if they are unaware that a child has let themselves out through the security door. Please reinforce this message with your child, reminding them that they should only leave the safety of the school building if they have spoken to a member of the school staff and that person knows they are leaving the building. If you need to look at lost property, please go via the reception office. Do not cut through from the north playground.
