Dear Parents and carers,

A warm welcome back to all of you who are returning to St Peter's for the academic year 2016-2017, and an especially heartfelt welcome to all the families and children who have joined the St Peter's community for the first time this September. Welcome also to the new staff who have started their employment at St Peter's in September. Everyone new to the school is joining a great learning team, and has an exciting year ahead to look forward to.

Our school year has got up and running with great pace and enthusiasm. Whole school worship has been a key feature of the start of the year, with a Mass by Fr Kevin from the Church of the Sacred Heart and St Peter the Apostle officially 'launching' the school year with a very loud countdown! Mrs Luter has led whole school worship centred around the Sunday Gospel readings, and I have been most impressed with the manner in which children of all ages have respectfully and thoughtfully engaged in classroom worship each day as well as singing out their praises with great gusto when the opportunity arises. Year group liturgies have begun, and these are a great opportunity to join the children in worship, prayer and reflection if family members are available to attend.

No sooner had we settled the children back into the school, than they started leaving in their droves to go on an exciting range of school trips. Year 3 started the ball rolling with a trip to Butser Ancient Farm, where amazing Miss Honeywell was able to keep her trainers wonderfully white all day long despite the rain and mud, and Year 4 extended their learning with an excursion to the ever popular Marwell Zoo. Having had a taste of life under canvas in July on the school field, Year 5 went to Runway's End Outdoor Centre near Farnborough for two nights for some adventurous activities, and Year 6 spent a full residential week at Stubbington Study Centre overlooking the waters of the Solent to engage in a wide range of curriculum enrichment activities. On behalf of the children who went on all these trips, and perhaps many of the families who sent the children away for a few nights, I pass on my great thanks to the staff and volunteers who help to arrange these valuable and memorable learning opportunities.

Our children who completed their Year 6 with us in July rounded off their education with a great set of results in the end of Key Stage 2 tests; they and their teachers should be rightly proud of their great achievements. As ever in education, though, attention turns now to the coming year, and I have already seen many examples of excellent teaching, high expectations, challenging demands and impressive outcomes for the children in our school. As the Government continues to 'raise the bar' of educational standards and expectations, I have every confidence in all of the staff in our school to deliver on these for the children, and I know the children themselves will rise to the challenge with enthusiasm and determination.

As always, this newsletter is full of important information about school life for everyone associated with St Peter's, but please keep checking the school website for any changes that may need to be made to planned activities. The calendar for the school year will be published, but does remain subject to change in the event of unforeseeable circumstances. Regular updates on the learning across the school, as well as a Headteacher's blog, can be found on the website blog area, and staff are using traditional written means as well as on-line resources to set home learning activities to complement the work done and progress made in school.

Stranger Danger:

An Oaklands pupil was approached on Stakes Hill Road by a man in a white van on Tuesday afternoon. Please talk sensitively with your child about what we do if strangers approach us.

In another incident a child who had been given permission to walk home alone, ran into the road past the School Crossing Patrol Officer. If your child walks home alone, please impress on them the importance of waiting until the SCPO indicates it is safe to cross.

Morning Drop off at St Peter's:

We encourage all parents to park offsite and walk your children into school in the mornings using the path through the playing fields.

If your youngest child is in Year 3, 4 5 or 6 and you need to drive onsite, please use the North Playground drop off point. It would be helpful if you could say goodbye to your child and ensure they have coat/lunchbox/bookbag ready to hand **before** you get to the drop off point so they can jump out quickly and not cause delay for other parents waiting behind you in the queue. Parents who drive and need to take a child to the South Playground (Years R, 1 or 2) please use the central car park but do not under any circumstances leave your car where it causes a blockage. If there is no room you may need to go around the circuit one more time. The best way for a calm start to the school day is to park offsite and walk in.

Message from a local resident:

"As a resident of Place Crescent, which is used by parents to drop off and collect their children from your school, it would be very much appreciated if you could please not use private driveways to turn your vehicles. This is a cul-de-sac and there is a designated turning point at the bottom of the road. This is a constant nuisance to myself and other residents. Thank you for your assistance in this matter".

CAFOD's Harvest Campaign:

Once again this Harvest we will be supporting CAFOD's campaign which this year is called 'Brighten Up this Harvest'. During this Year of Mercy, Pope Francis has asked us to rediscover the corporal works of mercy, one of which is to feed the hungry. We are asking that on Thursday, 6th October, all children come to school dressed as brightly as they possibly can - no hair dye please - and make a donation of £1 (or more) to CAFOD, our Catholic charity which helps tackle poverty and injustice across the world.
